


Bishop's Heart Honor

What is honor? The biblical words often translated as "honor" can have several different meanings. As a working definition, to honor means to esteem and treat others with respect because of who they are or what they have done. Honor has a sense of value, price, or quality. That which is valued and esteemed is "honored." The biblical use sometimes means to seek to enhance the reputation of someone. Peter tells us to "honor all people, love the brotherhood, fear God, honor the king." (1 Peter 2:17) The idea of honoring others, especially those in authority (the king), comes from the fact that they represent God's ultimate authority. A classic example is the command to "submit to the governing authorities because they have been established by God." (Romans 13:1-6) Therefore, "he who rebels against authority is rebelling against what God has instituted, and those who do so will bring judgment on themselves." (Romans 13:2) This means it is required of Christians to honor those whom God has placed over us through our obedience and demonstration of respect. To do otherwise is to dishonor God.

• Paul teaches that Christ-followers are to outdo one another in showing honor. Romans 12:10 says "Be devoted to one another in love." Honor one another above yourselves. In other words, Christians do not fall into the trap of lowering our commitment to honor someone else. Instead, Christians are called to honor one another without limitation. Christians are to make others feel like they are valued by the way they are loved and cared for. Honoring others motivates, inspires, builds up, and energizes the honoree. Honoring others makes those who feel insignificant, feel significant. One thing we can see through these scriptures is that honor does not only benefit those we are honoring, but it has benefits for us as well. God honors us for honoring others: "If anyone serves me, he must follow me; and where I am, there will my servant be also. If anyone serves me, the Father will honor him." (John 12:26) As we honor God, He honors us, but He may not honor us in ways that the world would consider to be honor such as status, wealth, and recognition. God honors us with health, strength, wisdom, longevity, etc. Let's begin each day by honoring others more than we honor ourselves and watch God bless us abundantly.

Encouraging Corner with CoPastor Purposed Freedom

"For you have been called to live in freedom, my brothers and sisters. But don't use your freedom to satisfy your sinful nature. Instead, use your freedom to serve one another in love." Galatians 5:13 NLT
