Bishop's Heart Harvest or Halloween

October 2023

Harvest and Halloween... the two go head-to-head seemingly every fall. Most scholars agree that Halloween originated around 2,000 years ago when Celtic people in Europe celebrated the end of the harvest and the start of a new year in a festival called Samhain. People also believed they could commune with the dead more easily during that time, lighting bonfires to ward off ill-intentioned spirits, according to the American Folklife Center. Robert E. Wolverton, a classics professor at Mississippi State University, said "On that night, it was thought that ghosts and witches wandered the country. Some were good - that is, ancestors of the living - but others were bad and sought to harm."

The controversial question is whether Christians should celebrate Halloween or better yet, what is holy about Halloween. Scripture does not speak at all about Halloween, but it does give us some principles on which we can make a decision. In Old Testament Israel, witchcraft was a crime punishable by death (Exodus 22:18; Leviticus 19:31; 20:6, 27). The New Testament teaching about the occult is clear. Acts 8:9-24, the story of Simon, shows that occultism and Christianity don't mix. The account of Elymas the sorcerer in Acts 13:6-11 reveals that sorcery is violently opposed to Christianity.

In the 13th chapter of the book of Acts Paul called Elymas a child of the devil, an enemy of righteousness, and a perverter of the ways of God. In Acts 16, at Philippi, a fortune-telling girl loses her demonic powers when an evil spirit is cast out by Paul. Interestingly, Paul refused to allow even good statements to come from a demon-influenced person. Acts 19 shows new converts who abruptly broke ties with their former occultic practices by confessingChrist, showing their evil deeds, bringing their magic paraphernalia, and burning it before everyone (Acts 19:19).

As believers we celebrate Harvest. Harvest refers to the time during autumn when farmers traditionally bring in crops to supply their community throughout the year. Although our food today is more likely to come from the supermarket, Christians believe it is still important to remember God as the creator and thank Him for the good things He provides. Harvest is biblical! Feasts connected to harvest are mentioned in the Bible. The Feast of Weeks (Shavuot) marked the first fruits of harvest, and the Feast of Ingathering (Sukkot) marked the end of harvest. Exodus 23.16 (NIV) says, 'You shall keep the feast of ingathering at the end of the year when you gather in from the field the fruit of your labor.' It is described in Exodus 34:22, (KJV) as the 'Festival of Ingathering at the year's end' or the 'Festival of the Final Harvest.' (NLT). It marked the end of the harvest and the agricultural year. Harvest is a time when we pause and say thank you "Lord" for the abundance of blessings in our lives. So as we start the Harvest season we celebrate and pray a bountiful and abundant Harvest to each of you. We also speak the blessings of the Lord to manifest in your life in this season.
