

Bishop's Heart Don't Give Up

In Charles Schultz's multivolume <u>Peanuts</u> collection, there is a story where Charlie Brown tells Lucy: "All you have to do is hold the ball. Then I'll come running and kick it."

Recently, I came across the book <u>Kick the Football, Charlie Brown</u> in J5's book collection which highlights the same scene that I read as a child.

The storyline was the same, Charlie Brown comes running in his pursuit of kicking the football but, at the last moment, Lucy pulls back the football, giving several explanations to the prostrate kicker: "I was afraid your shoes might be dirty, Charlie Brown. I don't want anyone with dirty shoes kicking my new football," etc. Charlie Brown responds in agony and disappointment: "Don't you ever do that again! Do you want to kill me?"


Many of us can remember that Lucy would continue to do the same thing over and over again. Charles Schultz said as he wrote this story that Charlie Brown would never kick that football, but, he also thought having him succeed would have been a disservice to the character.

We can find a little Charlie Brown in all of us, and trying to kick that football reveals who we are and sometimes who we are not. Depending on our perspective, we can do two of several things; either we will keep trying and not learn from our past experiences or we refuse to give up on the future. For the Christian, it depends on our perspective.

Charlie Brown can also represent the life of a Christian - He doesn't give up on himself; he doesn't give up on others; he lives in hope, and kicking the football is his focus and goal. How we handle persecution and trials depends on how we see ourselves through the eyes of Christ. Perseverance is vital to growing in our faith, and God wants His people to persevere no matter what happens. So we have to learn how to overcome obstacles, difficulti

es, trials, and tribulations to experience victory in Christ. We have two choices when faced with hardship - trust in God and keep our vision on Him or quit and abandon hope. God has so much more in store for us. His plan for us is that struggles and hardship lead to blessings and rewards if we persevere! Romans 5:3-5 New King James Version (NKJV) says "And not only that, but we also glory in tribulations, knowing that tribulation produces perseverance; and perseverance, character; and character, hope." Many of us will look at life and say I will not allow anyone to treat me like Lucy treated Charlie Brown. However, Lucy doesn't represent a person. She represents the continued, unexpected attacks of the enemy. Luke 4:13 says "And when the devil had ended all the temptation, he departed from him for a season."

We will never be able to control the seasons, the attacks of the enemy, or how people treat us. We can only control who we are and how we respond to those seasons and attacks. It is, after all, a great question that life poses... Are we a Charlie Brown or a Lucy? Charlie Brown is not vulnerable. Instead, he represents a strong believer who hopes, loves, forgives, and preservers through every difficulty in life. Don't give up. We should never give up. Let's keep pushing toward our goal and trust God that we too will kick the football.

Discipled Wisdom

Proverbs 1:7 says, "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and instruction." KJV

Many of us have heard the story about the young lady who was cooking a pot roast. She was an amazing chef and she would always season the roast to perfection then cut the roast in half, putting only half of the roast in the pan. One day someone asked her why she cut her roast in half, and she proudly replied "That's the way my mom did it, so that's the way I do it." The question of her culinary process compelled her to ask her mother why she cut her roast in half. Her mother explained to her "I cut the roast in half because I only had one small pan and the roast was too big."

Intentionally or not we are discipled by someone. Although cooking a pot roast isn't the best example of being discipled, it shows the impact of influence on our legacy. We don't have to be parents or pastors or teachers but we all have influence. We influence our families, our schools, our relationships, our social affiliations, and everywhere we go.

If we are being discipled by someone we should be sure that they are knowledgeable and wise. The Bible says in the King James Version of Proverbs 1:7 "the fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge," which infers that there is an appropriate kind of fear or reverence that results in a blessed life and strong faith. Along with reverence for God - comes wisdom. Without wisdom, we run the high risk of being foolish.

Not many of us would go to someone who had no knowledge or wisdom for advice. We wouldn't go to a doctor or even a mechanic who had no knowledge or experience to solve our problem. We wouldn't ask someone who didn't cook how to prepare a dish. We should live the same way. Either we are being discipled and/or standing in the role to disciple someone else. Whichever role we find ourselves in we should want to be wise and not foolish which pleases our Heavenly Father.
